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Office of the District Attorney Summer 2026 Undergraduate Programs

The Office of the District Attorney is recruiting undergraduate students for two programs for the Summer 2026 session. All students will gain experience working directly with DA legal assistants and prosecutors. Students will also have opportunities to work with members of the public. Accepted students must complete an in-person orientation on Monday, May 18, 2026.

Legal Support Internship (open to rising Juniors and Seniors)

- Interns work 10 weeks during Summer from May 18-July 24, 2026.
- Interns work 40 hours per week and must have consistent availability.
- Interns will work on case file preparation and organization, correspondence with victims and law enforcement, evidence review, subpoenas, and indictments.
- Students are paid \$12/hour and course credit is optional.

Undergraduate Practicum (open to all students)

- Practicum students work between 10 and 14 weeks during the Summer (start May 18 and finish sometime between July 24 and August 21, 2026).
- Practicum students work 15 hours per week and must have consistent availability.
- Practicum students will do courtroom observation, file disposition, document preparation, and discovery disclosures.
- Positions are unpaid and may be taken for course credit.
